



RESEARCH STUDY OF THE PRO-LIFE/PRO-CHOICE CAUSE

Methodology

- Online interviews were conducted with 1,000 adults (18-69 yearold) living across the country.
- Interviews were conducted in May 2019.
- Key Process Goals
 - A stratified random sample procedure based on gender, agegroup, Hispanic culture, ethnic background, and area across the United States was used to insure the sample reflected the Untied State demographics, so the results could be generalized to the population.
 - Care was taken to insure the survey would be unbiased. Only 3%, N=34 dropped out during the survey.



We Were Successful In Developing and Fielding An Unbiased Survey



Biased Survey

The difference noted above (Pro-life/pro-choice) is not statistically significant. Therefore, the the survey did not skew one direction or the other.



- 25-54 year olds
- Live in South or Midwest
- Evangelical but 42% feel it is legal.
 This could be an interpretation of the current law compared to a person's personal viewpoint






Personally And Directly Affected By Issues – "Yes"




How do you feel about the **amount** of news and information on each of these topics








Sample Demographics – Gender / Age





Sample Demographics – Race / Hispanic/ Region








